

BLINDLEY HEATH COMMON

Surrey Wildlife Trust has applied to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for consent under section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 to carry out restricted works on Blindley Heath Common. The Planning Inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The proposed works are: to extend a length of fencing measuring 166m at Blindley Heath. The work will allow cattle to graze without the risk of crossing the brook and gaining access to Ray Lane. This will create a line of fencing and will not create an enclosure allowing access through the existing gate and stile.

The fencing will be located south of the Ray Brook, when accessing off Ray Lane.

A copy of the application form and accompanying documents had previously been made available on 29th January 2020 for inspection at Surrey Wildlife Trust, School Lane, Pirbright, Woking, Surrey GU24 0JN during normal office hours until 2nd March. This notice refers to the same application documents which are now available until **27th May 2020**.
