25	1 QUESTIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC	
	Due to the attendance of Cllrs Chris and Sue Farr, Cllr Beagley with the agreement of all Cllrs present, moved agenda item 7. Planning to the end of the meeting. Also, with the agreement of all Cllrs present Cllr Beagley moved agenda item 8.5.1 for discussion under agenda item 1. Questions from Members of the Public to allow family members present to speak and answer questions.	
	8.5.1 Exhumation – To consider and agree or otherwise whether the Parish Council (PC) will pay for the exhumation of ashes from Grave 458. Cost £850 ex VAT. Includes professional fees and digging - The Clerk briefed the Parish Council advising that ashes needed to be exhumed from the grave space to allow future burials. The family stated that they had not been informed that if ashes were interred in the grave space future burials would not be allowed. The Clerk advised that the interment had taken place over 20 years ago and she could not find any evidence to contradict the family's assertions. The PC asked who would have been responsible for informing the family. The Clerk advised that it would have been the responsibility of the Clerk at the time. After an indepth discussion IT WAS AGREED that its decision would not set a precedence, however, the PC would fund the cost of the exhumation and for the Clerk to make the arrangements.	JC
	1.1 A resident has written to the Clerk to ask if the Parish Council (PC) is going to cut back overhanging trees at the Track Leading to Little Mead, The Common, Blindley Heath this autumn – IT WAS AGREED that the Clerk would obtain quotes to cut back the trees.	JC
	1.2 A resident has written to the Clerk asking if the PC could put a sign up at the Horse Pond like the one at the seating area on the path by Bay Pond advising people not to feed bread to the Ducks – The PC decided to defer the decision to the next meeting and IT WAS AGREED that the Clerk would obtain quotes for a sign that would contain historical information about the Pond and information about the danger of feeding bread to the ducks. IT WAS ALSO AGREED that the Clerk provide the PC with information about the danger of feed bread to ducks and whether it could cause Angel Wing.	JC JC
	1.3 A resident has written to the Clerk asking about the path running along Ivy Mill Lane, and whether the PC can put in a proper path as it is well used as there is a worn in track already there – The PC advised that there was not supposed to be a path there because it is Common Land. The PC also advised that there is big pipe that runs under the bund which would prevent the installation of a hard surfaced path.	

	 1.4 A resident has written to the Clerk regarding bigger children racing around the playground on their bikes (5 bikes and 1 scooter) to ask if anything can be done to prevent this. They noted there were no signs stating it was not allowed – The Parish Council agreed that riding bikes and scooters in the playground was dangerous and already not allowed and IT WAS AGREED that the Clerk would obtain quotes for signs to be made and installed. 1.5 A resident attended the meeting to speak about item 8.5.1 on the agenda. 						
	Cllr Beagley with the agreement of the other Cllrs, agreed to bring item 8.5.1 forward for discussion. 8.5.1 Exhumation: To consider and agree or otherwise whether the PC will pay for the exhumation from Grave 458, cost £850 ex VAT. Includes professional fees and digging – The resident reported that that in 2004 when interring her mother's ashes in grave 458, she had not been told that this would mean that burials would not be allowed in the grave. The Clerk confirmed there were no records of the resident having been told. IT WAS AGREED without setting a precedence, that the PC would fund the cost of the exhumation and the Clerk would instruct the funeral director.						
	1.6 John Farnaby attended the meeting to give a brief update on the progress of the Godstone Neighbourhood Plan. He advised that there had been a delay in it going out to Consultees, but it would be going out for comments next week. It would then go to the Planning Inspector and be assessed in May 2026.
